At the heart of Europe

Prague is one of the continent's finest cities. The city has a rich architectural heritage that reflects both the uncertain currents of history in Bohemia and an urban life extending back more than 1,000 years. The physical attractions and landmarks of Prague are many. Among the finest is the Charles Bridge, which stands astride the Vltava River. The winding course of the Vltava, with its succession of bridges and changing vistas, contrasts with the ever - present backdrop of the Prague castle. The narrow streets and little restaurants of the older quarters contrast with the broad sweep of Wenceslas Square, while the great 18th-century Baroque palaces have their own elegance and splendour. In 1992 the historic city centre was added to UNESCO's World Heritage List.



The Carolinum is a national cultural monument, the seat of the Rector, and a symbol of Charles University. The building has been named after the University founder Charles IV - Collegium Caroli (Caroline College). It has belonged to the Prague University since 1383.
